Cub Scout Adventure Programs

Tiger, Wolf and Bear Cub Scouts will participate in classroom activities, games and a wildlife hike through the Zoo as they complete their Adventure Notebook. At the completion of the program each boy will receive a signed certificate of completion.



The Tiger Adventure Program will focus on the following topics: Pet Care, Animals, and Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.



The Wolf Adventure Program will focus on the following topics: Your Living World and All About Birds.



The Bear Adventure Program will focus on the following topics: Take Care of Your Planet and Sharing Your World with Wildlife.

Cost: \$13 per person, minimum of 10 people. Price includes Zoo admission and program. One adult per five boys is free. Only Scouts and chaperones may attend program. Other guests may pay regular admission and spend the day in the Zoo.

Webelos “Naturalist Badge”

Webelos will participate in activities, games and a wildlife trek in the Zoo to complete four of the required activities to earn their Cub Scout Naturalist Badge. In completing the Wildlife Naturalist Notebook, the boys will be able to:

- Explain the difference between “poisonous” and “venomous”
- Identify poisonous plants found in Florida
- Describe several native species they’ve observed
- Explain and identify a bird flyway
- List several things a good naturalist should do when observing wildlife

*Each boy will receive a certificate after completing the program. Badges are not available at the Zoo.

Webelos “Forester Badge”

Webelos will participate in classroom activities and a hike through the Zoo to identify Florida native plants and trees as part of the Forester Activity Badge. In completing the activity badge the boys will be able to:

- Name the different types of forests growing in different parts of the country
- Label the different layers of a forest
- Identify Florida native trees and plants
- Describe how wildlife and humans use trees and plants
- Describe the process in which plants and trees make their own food
- Describe both the benefits and harm wildfires cause in a forest ecosystem
- List several ways to prevent wildfires

*Each boy will receive a certificate after completing the program. Badges are not available at the Zoo.
